

Teaching the EU Toolkits High School Lesson Plan 3.B What is the European Union? Why Was the EU Created?

Objective: I can explain why the European Union was formed in detail and understand the benefits of its existence.

Materials needed:

EU Basics PowerPoint Europe in a Nutshell (Teacher's Guide)

Agenda:

Teacher will explain what Europe was like after World War II using the "<u>Teacher's Guide to the</u> <u>European Union</u>." The PowerPoint to accompany the lecture includes details about the destruction that WWII caused and the importance of coal and steel in post-WWII Europe. If necessary, teacher will address vocabulary such as ally, treaty, and unity in order to ensure understanding. This can be achieved by creating a word wall with definitions. Teacher will then ask students to think about and reflect on why forming a unified group of European countries would be beneficial after World War II. The teacher will then lead the class in a discussion about why wars are fought and why peace is best, as well as about the role of allies in keeping peace.

Discussion guide: Why are wars fought? Why is it better to maintain peace? Why would we want to have a structure in place to try to avoid wars? Why would a uniting of countries in Europe be a good thing?

Teacher will then go over the basic features of the European Union using the "EU Basics" PowerPoint.

Conclusion: I can explain why the European Union was formed in detail and understand the benefits of its existence.
