WORLD WAR II

After the physical and financial destruction of WWII, European nations sought to find a way to prevent war and promote peace







COAL AND STEEL RESOURCES

SCHUMAN PLAN

- Orginally created by Jean Monnet
- European Coal and Steel Community (ECSC)
 - Create single authority to control production of coal steel
 - Mainly between France and West Germany
- Proposed by Robert Schuman on May 9, 1950
 - Celebrated as Europe Day
- "Inner Six" founding members
 - France, West Germany, Italy, the Netherlands, Belgium, Luxembourg



EUROPEAN COAL AND STEEL COMMUNITY

- Treaty of Paris ratified in 1952 by all 6 members
- Created a common market for coal and steel
- Goal: prevent buildup of resources that would allow for the rise of a military superpower and lead to war
 - Legacy of Germany in WWII
- First supranational organization
 - Policy controls all nations and has a higher authority than national laws
- Created base organization for what would eventually become the European Union



MAIN GOAL OF ECSC: WORLD PEACE
