Speaker Biographies

GALI BEERI. Gali Beeri is the Director of Outreach Programs for the European Union Center of Excellence/Center for European Studies at the University of North Carolina-Chapel Hill. She joined the center full time in May 2004. She coordinates the Center's outreach programs, exhibiting and presenting at local and national conferences, and produces the Center's biweekly newsletter. She holds a graduate certificate in Nonprofit Leadership, and a B.A. in International Studies and Political Science with a Business Administration minor from UNC-Chapel Hill.

ERICA EDWARDS. Erica Edwards is the Executive Director for the UNC Center for European Studies and European Union Center of Excellence. She received her PhD in Political Science from UNC Chapel Hill in 2007 and has been involved in a number of the Center's programs during her graduate study, most notably the Chapel Hill Expert Survey on Party Positioning and the UNC Video Consortium in EU Studies. Erica completed her undergraduate degree at the University of Arkansas in Fayetteville and obtained an MA in European Studies from the College of Europe in Bruges, where she was a Fulbright Scholar. Prior to joining CES in August 2009, she held academic positions at the Institute for Advanced Studies (IHS) in Vienna, Austria, and the Vrije Universiteit Amsterdam. Her main research and teaching interests are in the fields of comparative politics, political parties and party systems, European integration, and public opinion.

KLAUS LARRES. Klaus Larres is the Richard M. Krasno Distinguished Professor of History and International Affairs at the University of North Carolina in Chapel Hill. He is an expert on contemporary transatlantic relations, European integration and twentieth-century American, German and British foreign policies in comparative perspective. His work focuses on the impact of post-1945 American hegemony and the repercussions of U.S. driven globalization on the political, economic, security related and cultural transformation processes in Europe and elsewhere. His research interests include the international history of the Cold War and the economic and geo-strategic developments in the post-Cold War world. The history, politics and economics of the EC/EU also feature prominently in his work. Since 2009 he has been a Senior Fellow at the Center for Transatlantic Relations (CTR), a leading Washington, DC, based think tank and EU Center of Excellence. At present he is a public policy scholar at the Woodrow Wilson Center in Washington, DC.

JENNIFER RICKS. Jennifer Ricks is an Instructional Coach at the North Carolina Department of Public Instruction, in the Department of District and School Transformation. During the creation of the North Carolina Essential Standards, she has served as a middle grades consultant on the DPI Social Studies team. Ms. Ricks also has experience as a high school Social Studies teacher, administrator, and Director of an International Studies Academy.
